

WIBC SUMMER COMPETITION RULES

Singles, Knockout Singles, Pairs and Knockout Drawn Triples.

1. All games must be played by the closing date of each round.
2. All competitions are 2 hours with no trial ends, except for the Semi-finals and Final which will be 3 1/2 hours with trial ends, playing a full game.

THE SEMI-FINALS AND FINALS MUST START AT 9a.m. (NO LATER).

3. All competition games should be arranged promptly and the CHALLENGER (THE FIRST NAMED ON SHEET) is responsible to contact their opponent as soon as possible to arrange a mutually agreeable time to play. If the challenger has not offered any dates within the 14 days of the closing date of the round the opponent becomes the challenger to offer dates. The Challenger is also responsible for arranging a marker for single matches. Any member may mark singles games. (See sheet below for possible Markers).
4. All competitions must be booked in and written on daily play sheets on the day and time you are playing. **NO COMPETITIONS ALLOWED ON TUESDAYS, WEDNESDAYS 10-12 unless a club match is scheduled**

Please put names on the right-hand side of the relevant sheet denoting which competitions you are playing. Only 1 competition can be booked alongside a Spoons, or Aggregate session. **The preferred time for Competitions are Mon 12-2, Thu 12-2, Fri 12-2, Sat 12-2, Sun 12-2.**

RINKS FOR ALL COMPETITIONS WILL EITHER BE DRAWN OR ALLOCATED BY THE GREEN STEWARD PRIOR TO PLAY, SUBJECT TO RINK USAGE AT THE TIME.

5. In games which are not played a signed concession card has to be submitted to the Competition Secretary.
6. The nominated players in Pairs matches will normally play together throughout the Competition. One additional (and the same) player may however, be used as a substitute at any time, if they have not already played in the Competition and can play in any position. A named entrant cannot afterwards play in another team in the same Competition, irrespective if they have played in the Competition or not. Any game involving a substitute should be cleared by the Competition Secretary before the game is played, or in his absence by another officer of the Club.
7. An end has started immediately the jack has been cast. In the event of a game being tied an extra end is to be played and replayed to a conclusion. Toss for jack before the start of the extra end. NO JACK to be cast after the bell has sounded.
8. In matches of limited duration skips, (and individuals in singles) may only visit the head once per end. Leads may not visit the head.
9. The loser must sign the card.
10. Competitors make out own cards.
11. Any dispute must be referred to the Competition Secretary whose ruling will be final.
